Why bring a claim?

- Compensation
- Apology
- Rehabilitation/therapy/dependency treatment
- Acknowledgement
- Being believed
- Client-led process (different to criminal process)
- Loss of earnings
- Potentially life changing



Who are the Defendants?

- Suing an abuser in person directly
- Institutional Defendant:
 - Scout Association
 - Ministry of Defence
 - Church / religious orders, eg Jehovah's Witnesses, Catholic Church, Church of England
 - Sports clubs such as football clubs
 - Schools and youth clubs
 - Salvation Army
 - Children's homes
 - Charitable organisations
 - Local authorities



Time limits

- 3 year time limit / 21st birthday
- Reasons for the delay
- Is a fair trial still possible?
- Time continues to count even during lockdown



Process of bringing a claim

- Impact of lockdown
- Obtain police and court documents
- Letter before claim
- Obtain medical / educational / employment / counselling records
- Expert evidence
- Negotiate or proceed to Court process
- Therapy



Compensation

Compensation for pain and suffering

- Abuse/assault
- Psychiatric damage



Financial Losses

- Loss of earnings calculated approach or a lump sum basis
- Treatment costs
- Disadvantage on the labour market
- Prescription costs
- Travel costs
- Loss of familial support
- Costs of retraining/education
- Care costs
- Relocation costs
- Camouflage/make up
- Tattoo removal
- Wasted expenditure on alcohol



Criminal Injuries Compensation Authority

- Sometimes CICA is only option for clients
- Government run scheme
- Can award up to £500,000
- Smaller awards than civil



Limitation for CICA

- Strict deadlines 2 years from incident, or from reaching majority if it occurred in childhood, or from reporting to police
- Discretion if exceptional circumstances prevented reporting earlier and the CICA can process the application without making extensive further enquiries
